**Bills for Discussion**

The committee discussed the Dual Enrollment bills, AB 1122 and AB 731, and provided feedback for our GR Director to bring back to the authors' office.

Concerns included:

- Role of faculty in district dual enrollment agreements
- All dual enrollment classes leading to transfer and omitting CTE classes
- Removal of the inclusion of the counselor in the student permission process
- Managing the discipline of HS students in college classes
- Smaller college districts are handing over staffing and scheduling of CCAP classes to the high school districts
- Questioned whether the CCAP classes were targeting the “traditionally marginalized” students as directed in law

**The committee ran out of time for discussion on AB 1383, and the chair quickly summarized the CalSTRS concerns:**

CalSTRs Concerns:

- Increased costs for both the member contribution rate and the system itself, as well as the administrative burden of implementing the changes alongside other ongoing updates.
- The concern is not just about the raw dollar increases, but also the proportionality - that a large relative increase would go to a very small percentage of members at the top of the earnings scale. The cost impact is magnified because these members have the highest compensation to which the benefit formula is applied.
