#### Overview

- The transformation of the FACCC Advocacy Committee was discussed, including potential restructuring and development of new leadership platforms.
- Follow-up procedures from previous events, legislative advocacy strategies, and identification of potential advocates were focused on.
- Emphasis was placed on effective communication, continuing member immersion, and collaboration amongst committee members.

## **Advocacy Committee Transformation**

- Wendy Brill-Wynkoop proposed introducing different levels to the FACCC advocacy committees, such as the statewide planning and regional committees.
- The initiative is designed to foster the development of new leaders.
- The advocacy function may be moved to the Membership Committee to focus on leading and reacting to sponsored bills.
- New professional development opportunities for new legislative staffer, Anna, were discussed.
- Anna is developing an online module for advocacy webinars and trainings to boost member engagement.
- Kim Perigo and Wendy Brill-Wynkoop plan to invite Anna to the next meeting.

## **Follow-up from Previous Advocacy Events**

- Herlim Li and Kim Perigo suggested potential follow-up actions from their event last semester at San Diego.
- These include campus visits or meetings with legislative offices.

# **Legislative Advocacy Strategy**

- Kim Perigo suggested focusing advocacy efforts on influential members of educational committees.
- Wendy Brill-Wynkoop underscored the importance of targeting key areas such as Greater Los Angeles and rural regions represented by Senate pro tem, McGuire.

#### **Identification of Potential Advocates**

- Building stronger lines of communication with members from colleges within McGuire's jurisdiction was discussed.
- Potential liaisons, such as Cheryl Aschbosch from Lassen Community College, were identified to better understand issues faced by rural districts.

#### **Advocacy Core Responsibilities**

- Wendy Brill-Wynkoop outlined the core responsibilities of the Legends Advocacy Core.
- These include creating an annual advocacy strategy, bill packaging, and yearly budget recommendations.

#### **Committee Membership and Leadership Review**

- Wendy Brill-Wynkoop proposed a more rigorous selection process for committee chairs and members.
- The possibility of moving to smaller, dedicated committees instead of larger ones was discussed.

## **Post-Meeting Note Process and Access**

- Kim Perigo and Wendy Brill-Wynkoop discussed the process of accessing notes through the Circleback tool.
- All notes will be emailed to the chair and relevant staff members after the meeting.

## **Conflict of Interest Form Location and Access**

- Issues related to accessing and editing documents were discussed.
- Conflict of Interest forms had been emailed to all members, with reminders given regarding their importance.
- Nichole Barta, having difficulties finding the form, was reassured by Wendy Brill-Wynkoop and Kim Perigo of its location in previously sent documents.
